WOMEN EMPOWERMENT IN INDIA: ISSUES AND CHALLENGES, edited by Shikha Banerjee and Krittibas Datta. 2023. Mittal Publications. xiv+276 pp. ISBN 978-93-94569-75-1 (hbk). Price Rs. 1100.

This edited book is a collection of essays that at the core addresses various hindrances to women's empowerment and how they can be dealt with. It puts forth a multidimensional view of the notion of women empowerment touching upon the economic, social, cultural and political aspects and offers a critical analysis of the current trends and future prospects. The book has 28 papers whose contributors are from diverse backgrounds and experiences. The editors say that the book's focus on women's empowerment aligns with the NEP's vision, making it a valuable resource for policymakers, educators and anyone interested in promoting gender equality in education and society.

The first paper: "Entrepreneurship: A Direction towards Women Empowerment" by Arup Kumar Sarkar and Dev Kumar establishes a crucial link between women empowerment and entrepreneurship. It emphasizes on the education of women and the provision of safe work environments.
